

Now available: Australian eHealth Acute Care Research Report

CHIK's Australian e-Health Market Study: Acute Care 2004-2010 is now available for purchase.

This report presents the results of CHIK Services' independent research into the Australian Hospital Sector's use of information and communication technologies (ICT).

Building on previous research, the report focuses on 2007 to 2010 and also draws comparisons with 2002 and 2004 studies by the Collaborative Health Informatics Centre (CHIC) and CHIK Services respectively.

This report has been available to respondents and Syndicate members acknowledged below for a six month period since its completion in March 2009.
